A number of valley projects have had changes to the timeline recently. The changes are as follows:

Toronto Hydro Upgrades

- end date moved from February 2011 to June, 2011

Yonge /York Mills Channel Maintenance Program - TRCA (Toronto and Region Conservation Authority)

- deferred one year to fall 2011

Road and Sewer Infrastructure upgrades

- continuation deferred from April 2011 to July 2011

New Parkland by Miller Tavern

- deferred one year from May 2011 to May 2012

Build Toronto Development on the NW corner of Yonge and Wilson

- no longer under consultation

Roads and Sewer Infrastructure Upgrade

An Open House and public information session was held at the Agricola Church on March 31st 2011. During that meeting the plans for the 2011 phase of the works were presented.

At time of press, these plans were still on track, with expectation that work would begin on the resurfacing of Ivor Road in June 2011.

Work on the storm water systems for Donino Avenue, Donino Court, Plymbridge Road, and Maytree Road is scheduled to commence in July 2011. At that time the existing water-main for Donino Court will also be replaced. Mitigation measures will be in place to minimise the disruption to residents and to the neighbourhood.

We have received a commitment from the City to complete the remaining sections of the Valley by 2015. We have been advised that there are several infrastructure projects that will be completed during 2011 that will free up capital expenditure, which we expect to be deployed to the Valley project over the next 4 years. When we receive a more definitive calendar for this work, including the specific streets for each year, we shall advise the community.

Discussions with respect to traffic calming are scheduled to begin upon completion of the first section of the project.
